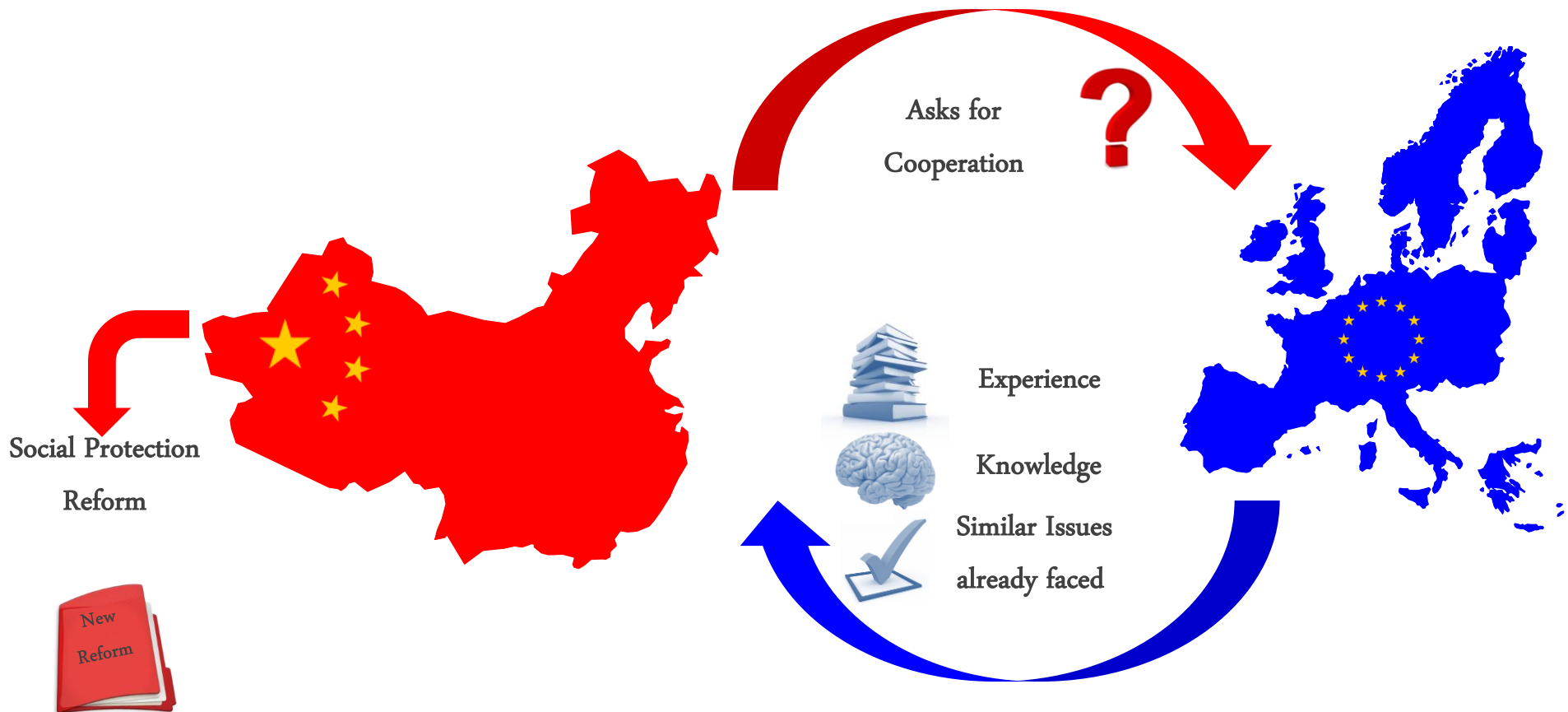


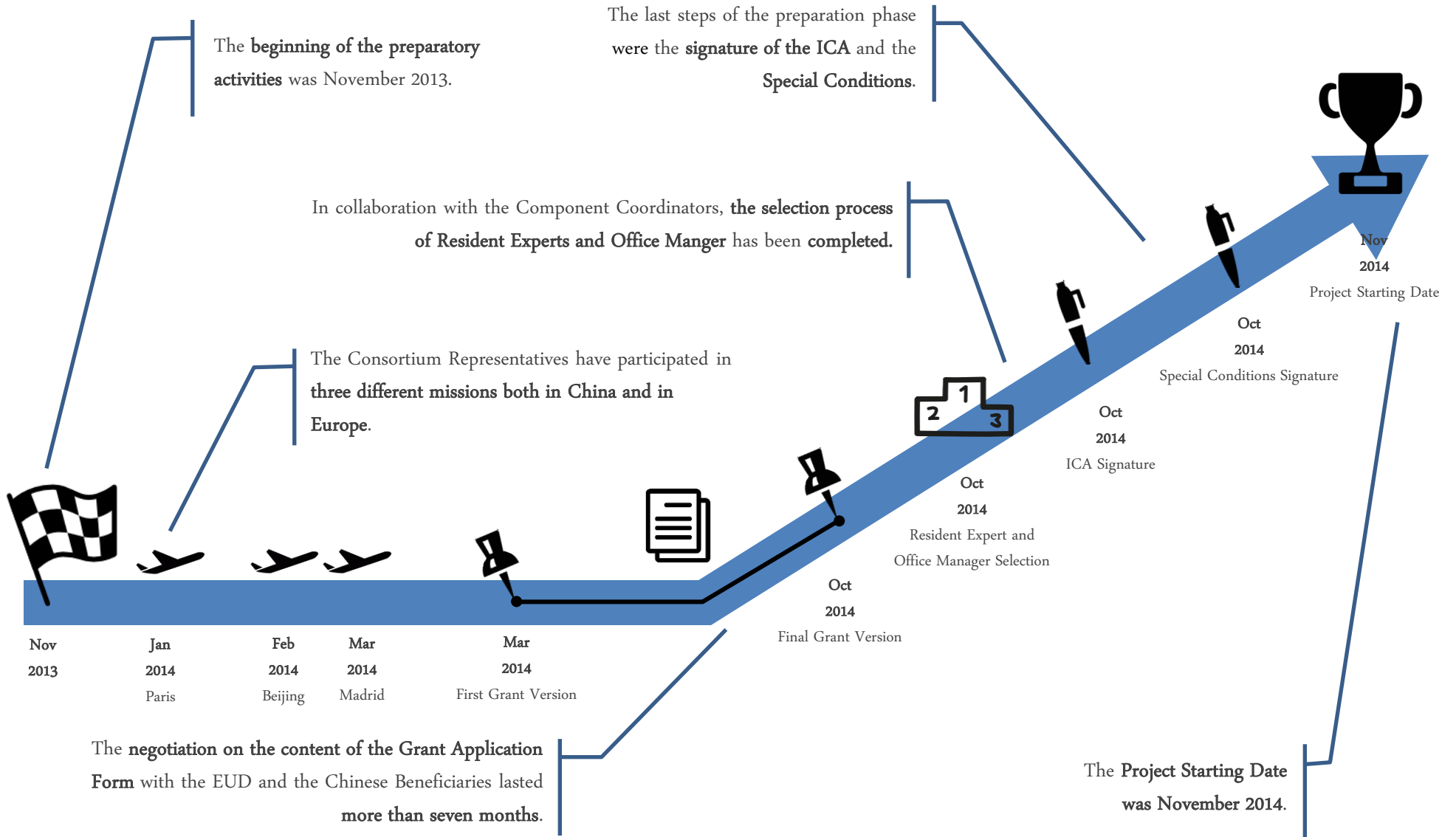
The development of the current **Social Security System in China** encounters a number of relevant **Issues**. These **main issues** are:

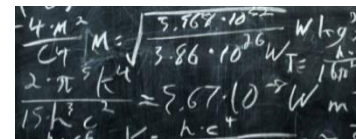

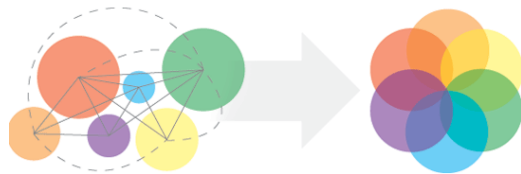

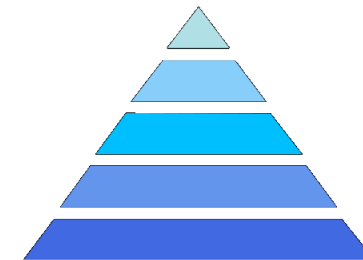
